

SCHOOL-AGE ACTIVITIES

Since libraries offer a variety of activities to school-age children, a sampling of this type of endeavor is presented here. These activities can stand alone or be combined to make unique programs. Some are crafts, some games and some adapted from Judah Hamer's Talk It Up! program. Judah, former young adult coordinator for BCCLS, designed a book-discussion program for grades 6-8 and included icebreakers and games in his program. A selection of these are included here (his book-discussion tips are in the Teen Section, pg. 250).

ACTIVITIES

Garden Wall Marble Shoot

Garden Wall Preparations:

Score a 22- by 28-inch grey poster board widthwise, across the center. At the point where the poster board is scored, cut several rectangles, squares or semicircles with an Exacto knife. Label the top of each opening with a score: 5 points for the largest, 10 points for medium-sized and 15 for the smallest. Fold the garden wall where it is scored and place half of it under a chair. Lean the other half on the legs of the chair so that the number of points can be read. Decorate so that it looks like a stone wall.

The Game:

Predetermine how far away from the “wall” the players must be when they shoot. Predetermine the number of chances each player gets to roll the marbles through the openings. Players who roll their marbles through the openings earn the number of points stated above the openings. After each player has had the predetermined number of chances, the player with the highest score is the winner. Award prizes to the winners.

Variation: Divide children into teams and pool their scores to get winners.

Each child who participates should receive a certificate or small prize.

Soap Making

Materials:

Plastic molds
Bar soap for soap making
Microwave-safe containers
Colors
Scents
Glitters

These soap-making materials are available at many craft stores. Kits with instructions are available.

Directions:

Choose a mold.
Label it with the child's name.
Use plastic knives to cut the bar soap into 1-inch pieces.
Put the soap cubes into microwave-safe containers.
Microwave for 15 seconds or until the soap melts.
Pour choices of colors, scents and glitters into individual containers with the melted soap.
Containers will be hot, so an adult must pour the soap into the molds.
If the soap begins to harden, microwave for a few seconds until the soap melts again.
It will take about an hour for the soap to harden, so children will have to pick up their soaps later in the day or the next day.
Putting the molds in the refrigerator speeds up the process, so you might be able to serve a snack and return the molds to the children after snack.

Sun Catchers**Materials:**

Black poster board, 22 by 28 inches
Bits of old crayons
Waxed paper
White craft glue
8-inch pieces of black yarn, 1 per child
Clear tape
An old iron
An ironing board, thick towel or piece of corrugated cardboard.
Circle patterns

Directions:

Trace and cut out the pattern for the circles from the black poster board. You will need 1 solid circle and 1 circle with the center cut out for each suncatcher.
You may want to have an adult cut out the circles with the centers cut out.
Cut out 2 circles from waxed paper for each craft.
Grate crayons on an old cheese grater, keeping colors separate (you may want to do this ahead of time).
Sprinkle the grated crayons in a pattern over the wax paper.
Cover the crayons with a second piece of wax paper.
Have an adult lightly iron over both layers with an iron.
Set at the lowest temperature. The 2 pieces of waxed paper will fuse.

When the waxed paper is cool, glue it to the solid circle.
Glue the second circle over the waxed paper.
Tape a piece of black yarn to the top of the circle so that it may
be hung from a window.

T-Shirt Decorating

Materials:

Newspaper
8 ½- by 11-inch sheets of white paper, one for each child
Fabric crayons
2 or 3 old towels
An old iron
Each child must bring an all-polyester white T-shirt

Directions:

Place a thick layer of newspapers on a table.
Cover the newspapers with a towel.
With fabric crayons, have children color pictures of their own
design on a piece of white paper.
The design will come out in reverse, so letters must be done
backwards.
Place the T-shirt on the towel.
Place a second towel, or some newspaper covered with a plain
white sheet of paper, inside the shirt between the front and the back.
Place the design face down on the T-shirt.
Have an adult do the ironing.
With no steam, and cool iron, iron over the design.
Carefully remove paper.

Variations: Use fabric paints or fabric markers to create a design directly
on the T-shirt.

Icebreakers

An *icebreaker* is an activity designed to help people become acquainted in a group setting. If people get to know each other, they will feel more comfortable about participating in group activities. The icebreakers offered here may be used *a la carte*. They have been selected for their degree of risk-taking, adaptability, interactivity and appeal to young adults. Many of these activities suggest a prize or award for the winner. Make this something simple, like a candy bar or a VERY cool bookmark. Some icebreakers ask group members to share something about themselves; share something about *yourself* first to get the ball rolling.

Bingo

Materials: Bingo Cards
Pens or pencils

Directions: Using the prepared bingo cards, ask group members to move around the room until they find a person who fits the description. That person signs his/her name in the appropriate slot. Tell participants they have 5 minutes to get as many signatures as possible. The first person to complete the sheet will win a prize.

Stinger*

Materials: Prizes for the winners

- Directions:**
1. Have group members form a circle and close their eyes.
 2. The discussion leader circles the group and selects a stinger by tapping the individual's shoulder.
 3. Group members open their eyes and talk with each other. While they do this, they introduce themselves by shaking hands. During this time, each member should try to spot the stinger.
 4. The stinger tries to eliminate everyone without getting caught.
 5. To eliminate people, the stinger injects poison with his/her index finger while shaking hands.
 6. Once stung, a person must wait at least five seconds to die.
 7. If someone thinks he/she has discovered the stinger, he/she can suggest the group make an accusation. But someone else in the group must second the accusation within 10 seconds.
 8. If the person does not get a second, another accusation cannot be made until someone else dies.
 9. If the accusation is wrong, both people who made it die.
 10. If they select the correct person, the stinger is dead, and the game is over. Both the stinger and the correct accusers win. If the stinger kills all, he/she wins.

*This game works better with a larger crowd.

Lollipop Game

Materials: Dum-dums or Charms (Blow-pop) lollipops

Directions:

1. Each group member chooses a lollipop.
2. Depending on the size of the group (and how well members know each other), you may want to break into mini-groups of three to five people. If you have a small group, you probably won't want to break it up at all.
3. Ask everyone in the group to count the number of letters the flavor of his/her lollipop has. (E.g., *GRAPE* is five.)
4. For each letter counted, the group member should share one fact about him or herself. If someone has a flavor with more than five letters (like the poor soul who's just chosen *WATERMELON*), let this person divide the number of letters by two.

Solemn & Silent

Materials: None needed

Directions:

1. Group members line up in two rows, face to face.
2. No one may speak or laugh.
3. The first to smile or laugh must sit down.
4. Anyone who remains standing then takes a new partner.
5. Continue until only two remain.
6. Once participants are disqualified, they can try to make others smile/laugh.

Truth, Truth, Lie

Materials: None needed

Directions:

1. Ask each group member to think of three facts about himself/herself, two the truth and one a lie.
2. Each person presents the three "facts." Other group members guess which fact is actually a fiction.

Madlibs

Materials: Madlibs & a pen

Directions: Group members take turns choosing a series of words, which are used to complete a story that has key words missing. Someone reads aloud the passage when all the blanks have been filled. (The several passages here might be used during a couple of sessions if your group really likes this game.)

Whose Line is **That**? *Whose Line*

is it Anyway? is a television show in which four actors improvise scenes given to them by the host. They might be required to sing about an audience member, speak only in questions, become strange superheroes or take on bizarre quirks. Whose Line is **that**? is a game

modeled on this popular television show. **How to play** 1. Divide the group into two teams. Each team should select members to be on the panel of judges. The panel should be evenly drawn from each team. Though the size can be flexible, it should have between two and six judges. 2. Explain that the host will give each team the same scene to present. The job of the judges is to assign a point value between 1 and 10 for the performance. The facilitator acts as the host, keeping track of the score and time. 3. Teams are given one minute to prepare for the scene. The scene must be two minutes or shorter. 4. If judges assign the same point value to a presentation, neither team earns the points. If a team is not happy with a judge, it has one chance to bump the judge from the panel, replacing the person with another teammate. A "bumped" judge becomes part of the team. Here are three things judges should consider when they give a score: All team members participate. The guidelines and restrictions of the scene are followed. The scene is entertaining.

Scenes Each scene includes a list of optional parts. This will

enable the scenes to be expanded, depending on the size of the team. The facilitator makes the decision about how many of the optional parts are necessary. **Movie**

Madness Three people at the movies. Two come together on a date. A man who sits next to them has repulsive and annoying habits. Neither of the dates may speak to this person directly, but they attempt to get the message across that he/she is irritating them. *Optional parts* Elderly couple with heavy accents sitting behind the three people, They are appalled that the young couple is at the movies without a chaperone. Little boy and parent. Boy has to go to the bathroom, but parent won't let him. Movie usher who is complaining angrily about having to clean the cinema bathrooms. **Who Dun' It?** A television

discussion between two to three mystery writers and Jenny Jones. Neither the writers nor Jenny may say the word *mystery, book* or *novel*. The conversation must cover the following topics: their best-selling novels, dog shows, the U.S. Civil War and Ricky Martin. *Optional parts:* Audience member who sings the questions he/she asks. Audience member who is angry and belligerent about the ending of one of the mysteries. He/she believes the guilty character in one of the novels portrays him. Cameraman who is in love with Jenny Jones

and only speak in the form of questions. **Hansel & Gretel** Hansel & Gretel live in a high rise near Central Park. They are supposed to be doing their chores while their mother Gertrude is at the local Zabaars. While Gertrude is out, they decide to explore the park but are caught by the Wicked Maid of the West, who is determined to pickle them in cleaning solution. *Optional parts:* Fox from "Little Red Riding Hood" is lost in Central Park, too. Gertrude may or may not be an acting role. If it is, she should speak in rhyme. Policeman. He gallops instead of walks (as if he's on a horse). He also speaks as if he *were* a

horse. **Translation** Billy Bob, a New Jersey native but long-time resident of Texas, explains to a class of third-graders how driving cattle on the range is similar to getting out of the Paramus Plaza at closing time. The teacher, Miss Priss, continually interrupts Billy Bob, restating what he has said. She fears his Texas accent is so heavy the students don't

understand him. *Optional parts:* Student in the front row who Miss Priss has denied permission to use the bathroom. Angry vegetarian parent who has volunteered to grade papers for Miss Priss. The parent has a monologue about getting Miss Priss fired for having the rancher to class. Student who can't help but interrupt Billy Bob, asking many odd questions about driving cattle. **Wheel of Misfortune** Vanna has arranged to take over the show by having Pat shipped off to a desert island. (There may or may not be a person who plays Pat on the desert island.) She is angry and determined to change the way the wheel is spun and the game show is run, and Vanna lets her contestants know this. No one is allowed to say "Big money." Vanna has hired Thornton Humberdink to turn letters. Though very good-looking, he is legally blind and refuses to wear glasses or contacts. Contestant One is Bottlecap Brewha, who changed his name to reflect his favorite drink, root beer. Bottlecap utters the words "root beer" at least once in every sentence. Contestant Two is Mary Kay (the cosmetics queen), whose real reason for being on the show is the free publicity. Her plan backfires, however, because she is so nervous. Mary turns out to be the stereotypically screechy giddy contestant who can't help but yell, "Big Money!" The third contestant is Mr. Michael Smith, Esq. He makes it known to Vanna that the "big money" restriction is a violation of free speech. He uses synonymous phrases for big money, such as *large funds* and *gross profits*. All in all, though, Smith is the most balanced of the contestants.

Name that Tune!

Directions:

1. Divide the group into two teams. Each team should choose a leader. Explain that the goal of the game is for a team to guess a song title after hearing as few words from the lyrics as possible.
2. **The challenge.** The coin-toss winner decides whether or not the

team wants to challenge first. Each team gets two chances to challenge for each song. For example, Team A might say, "We can guess the song in 10 words." Team B might counter, "We can guess it in 8." Team A has one more chance to change its number, as does Team B. Teams must guess in fewer than 15 words.

3. The team that has given the lowest number has first chance at guessing the title of the song within 30 seconds. If the team guesses correctly, both teams go back to challenging. If the team is wrong (or doesn't know the answer), the other team has a chance either to guess the song or to hear the number of words it stated in the challenge and *then* guess the song.

4. If neither team knows the song, do a second round of challenges. If, after this round, the teams still don't know the song, reveal the title/artist and move on to the next song.

5. The team that guesses the song correctly always decides whether to challenge first. If neither team guess correctly, the team that either won either the coin toss or the last challenge chooses whether it would like to challenge first.

6. The facilitator decides how long the game lasts, either by setting a time limit or limiting the number of rounds.
